



Specialty Contact Lens Student Travel Grant Application

On an annual basis, Art Optical will award travel grants for eligible students and residents to attend a specialty contact lens meeting. Art Optical's technical team will review all submissions and select winners based on the relevance of the topic and the quality of the content. Submissions must feature the use of an Art Optical lens design(s). Grant values are \$500 for content selected that has not been submitted/accepted for presentation and \$750 for content that has been submitted and accepted for presentation at the specified meeting. Award recipients will be notified within two weeks of the submission deadline for each meeting. Winners will be awarded their grants in person at the mutually agreed meeting.
